A culture of open communication will allow the entire acquisition workforce to identify innovative capabilities, share best practices, learn from mistakes, and align missions among buyers and sellers in the marketplace. Such a culture also allows the federal government and its contractors to have a better understanding of each other's needs, constraints, and areas for confluence all focused on delivering capability to the warfighter. Developed with this need for communication in mind, the North Carolina National Guard Association developed its corporate membership program.
